The Algarve

The Algarve is one of the best hot places to visit in November, with weather that will have you reaching for the swimwear and sprinting to the beach. Temperatures average around 23°C which means balmy pool afternoons will quickly become part of your routine.

Spend your days strolling the cobbled streets of historic towns like Lagos and Albufeira, visiting ancient castles, and shopping for tasty treats in the lively traditional markets. Architecture in The Algarve is quite something to behold, especially the splendid Baroque churches adorned with the famous blue azulejo tiles. The quaint, whitewashed houses that punctuate the rolling hillsides will tug on your heartstrings too.

Ready for some seaside fun? Then savour the feeling of soft sand between your toes on Praia do Barril, where golden swathes and crystal-clear water are perfect for picnics and swimming. Curiously, there's also an anchor cemetery here that gives a nod to the local fishing heritage. Ponta da Piedade is another must-see, where dramatic headland formations provide a romantic backdrop for sunsets. Proposals are optional!

Breathe in the fresh sea air on a boat tour or kayaking excursion along the rugged Algarve coastline, stopping at secluded beaches and snorkelling in turquoise lagoons. Intrepid explorers love swimming into Benagil Sea Cave – the imposing rock arches make for enviable holiday photos. Once the haunt of pirates, these shores are now the ultimate adventure playground for travellers looking for some winter sun.

Bright days give way to sultry evenings when outdoor dining comes into its own. Feast on locally caught seafood on candlelit restaurant terraces, or enjoy relaxed in-villa meals beside the pool under a sky full of twinkling stars.

If you're searching for a warm short-haul holiday in November, the Algarve ticks all the boxes.

The Gulf Coast

If you're thinking about where to go on holiday in November, the Gulf Coast is a great long-haul choice. Florida temperatures reach 26°C, which is a world away from the bleak days back home. Once you've settled into your villa and taken a dip in the pool, it's time to discover why this tropical seaside destination is so dreamy.

The sun-drenched beaches and warm waters of the Florida Keys have won the hearts of many a traveller. Sail out to sea and dive into the magical marine kingdom below the waves. You can snorkel with angelfish as they dart playfully around the reefs, and keep your eyes peeled for manta rays too. Dry off on the white sand or dig into a romantic picnic whilst soaking up the rays.

Over in the Everglades, you can skim across the water on an exhilarating airboat tour or paddle through the mangroves by kayak, getting up close to swamp life. Alligators lurk in the shallows and turtles sun themselves on branches, so make sure your camera batteries are charged!

When it comes to culture, the Gulf Coast has a surprising amount to offer. Take the family to the Ringling Museum for insider circus secrets or satisfy your artistic side at the Dali Museum in St. Petersburg. Finally, pop to Ernest Hemingway's house and pay your respects to this literary giant.

Get the adrenaline pumping with a parasailing session over the beaches of Tampa or play a round of golf on a world-class course. Fancy some shopping? Then treat yourself to a bit of me-time in the independent boutiques before indulging in a lazy café lunch.

Gran Canaria

If you're keen to travel somewhere with hot weather in November, then how about Gran Canaria? Winter is a distant memory as you step off the plane and embrace average temperatures of 25°C. The sandy beaches, historical villages, and water activities make this volcanic island a magnet for sunseekers.
